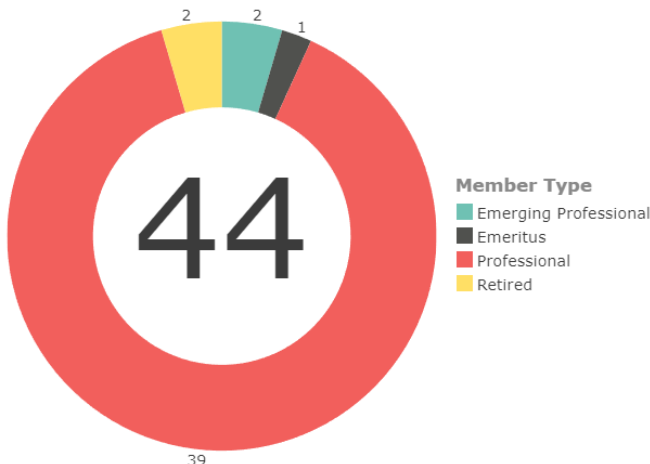

NEW POLICY FOR MEALS AT CHAPTER MEETINGS STARTS IN JANUARY 2023



The Knoxville CSI Chapter's dues of \$130 previously funded the monthly meal costs. The dues structure change implemented by CSI Institute in 2022 specifically states that the chapter dues of \$130 may no longer cover the cost of meeting meals. The chapter board voted in November 2022 to institute a fee for monthly chapter meeting meals to address this new requirement. Members will be charged \$10 per meal with reservation in advance or \$15 without reservation.

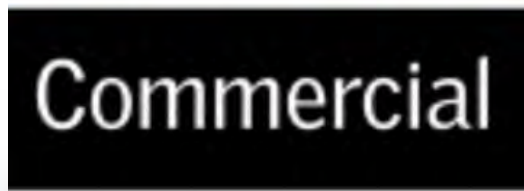
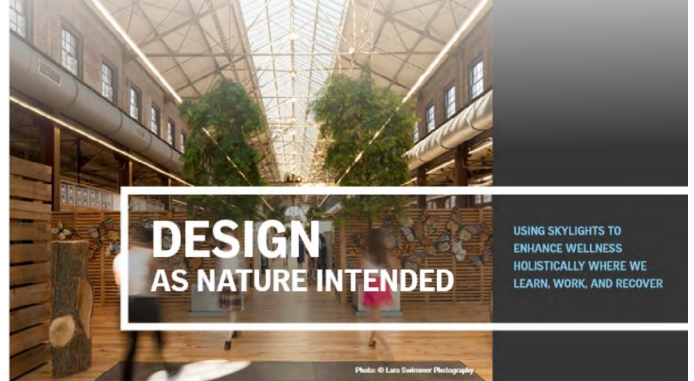
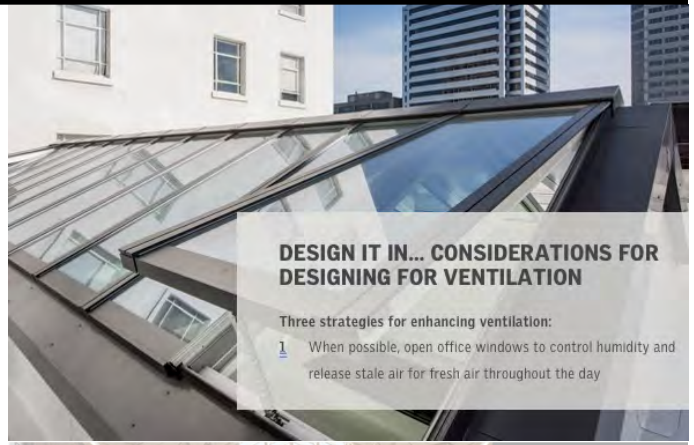

WHAT I LEARNED FROM CSI...

OIL INTERCEPTORS

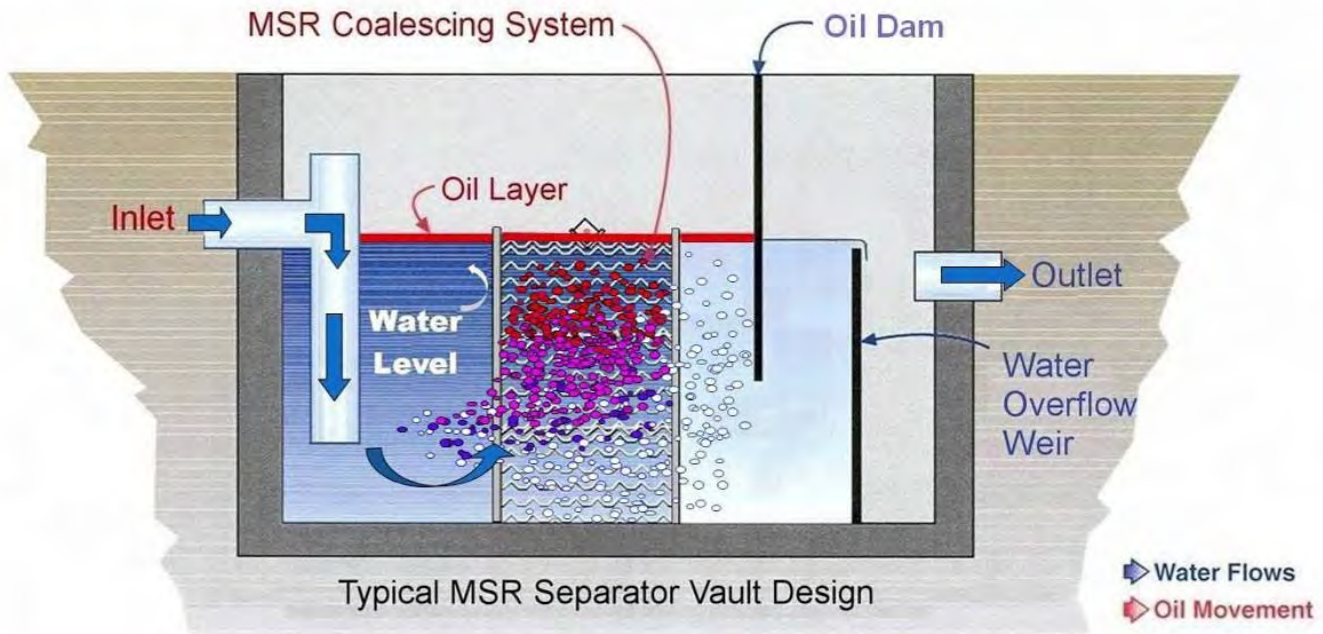


Market Square Parking garage sediment trap and oil interceptor covers (Downtown, Knoxville, TN)

Many of us drive into a multi-level parking garage and may notice the oil spots left from the various vehicles in the parking areas, but how many of us consider where that oil ends up as it flows down the drain holes? Many parking garages and other facilities are designed with floor and/or trench drains connected via waste piping to below grade oil interceptors which remove oil from the wastewater before it is discharged to the public drainage system. Oil interceptors are also used in car washes, vehicle repair garages, auto dealerships, hydraulic elevator pits, airplane hangars, and factories where oily waste is produced. The intent of the oil interceptor is to prevent environmentally dangerous and possibly flammable hydrocarbon substances from entering the municipal wastewater piping and/or treatment plant.

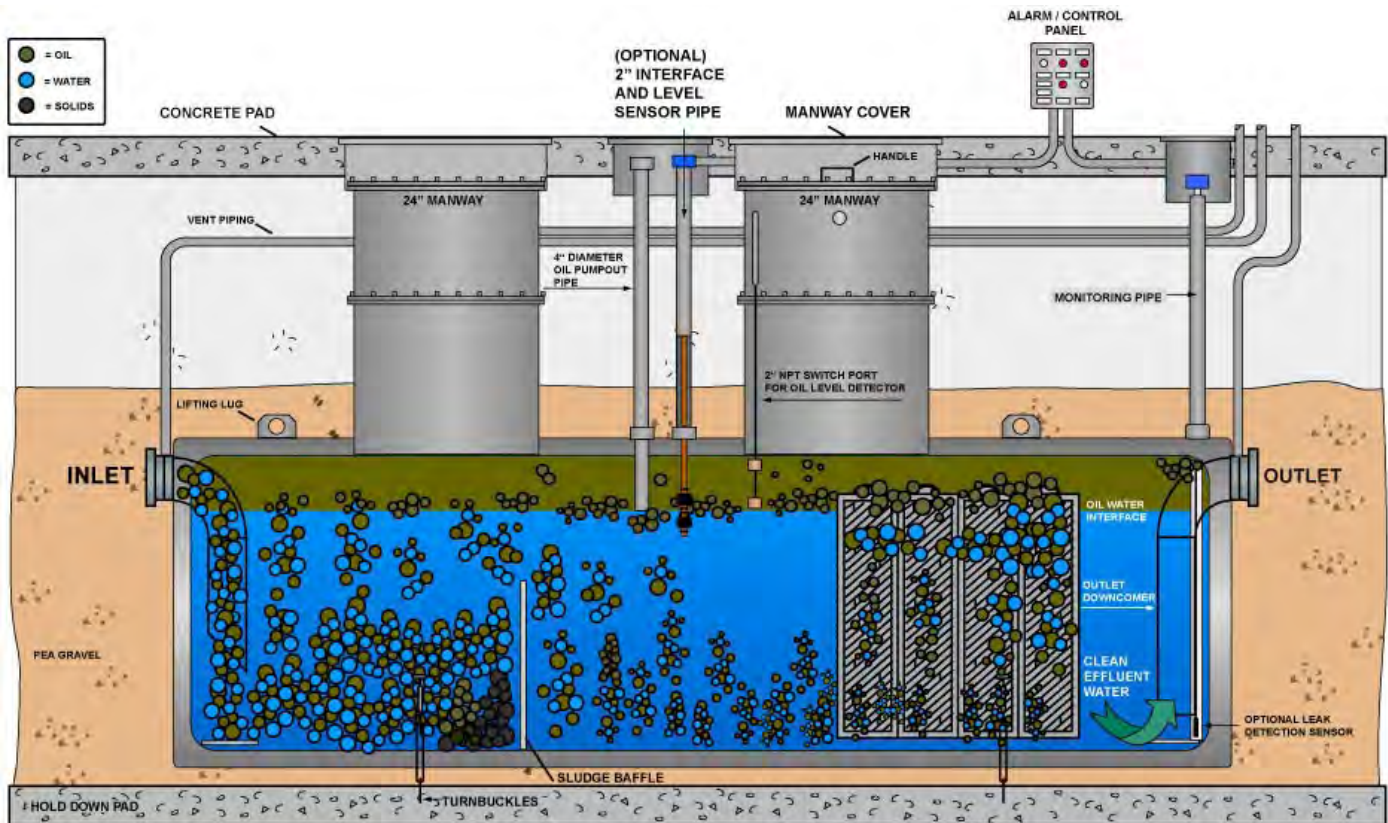
An oil interceptor is similar to a grease interceptor used in restaurants, but the number of internal chambers, baffles, and separation method vary between them. Most oil interceptors are designed with at least three internal chambers which

gradually reduce the sediment and hydrocarbons in the wastewater. They can be fabricated from high strength concrete, fiberglass, High Density PolyEthylene (HDPE), or steel, but some public wastewater utility companies have their own approved designs. The oil interceptor should be “pumped out” on a regular schedule through the manholes to remove the oil/hydrocarbons and sediment then the material is disposed in a sewer utility- approved manner. The size of the holding tank is determined by local codes, and usually determined by the area being drained and the number of floor and/or trench drains in the system. As the water enters the tank, a baffle plate reduces the flow and turbulence so that oils rise to the surface of the water. The tank collects oil and sediment and then stores it for later disposal. Clean water passes through to the stormwater/sewer system. Government environmental standards have increased specifications for stormwater systems.

Oil leaking from vehicles and manufacturing facilities can cause hydrocarbons to contaminate rivers, groundwater and soil. Drains in parking garages, vehicle-maintenance facilities and manufacturing plants collect water runoff that may contain oil or sediment. Oil interceptors filter the water and store the oil and sediment. Business owners install oil separators to prevent environmental pollution and avoid costly fines.

Most people don't consider this, but most car wash facilities recover and reuse most of the water used in the process because water is a costly resource. The wastewater, which after doing an undercarriage wash, can include sediment, grease and oil and goes through three treatment tank stages. Stage 1 is a solids settling tank, stage 2 is an oils and solids separation tank, and stage 3 usually goes through a water filtration, odor reduction and water polishing tank. The "cleaned" wastewater is then sent to a holding tank where it is pumped back to the car wash system to be reused. The oil from the stage 2 tank is sent to an oil interceptor for final separation before draining to the public sanitary sewer.

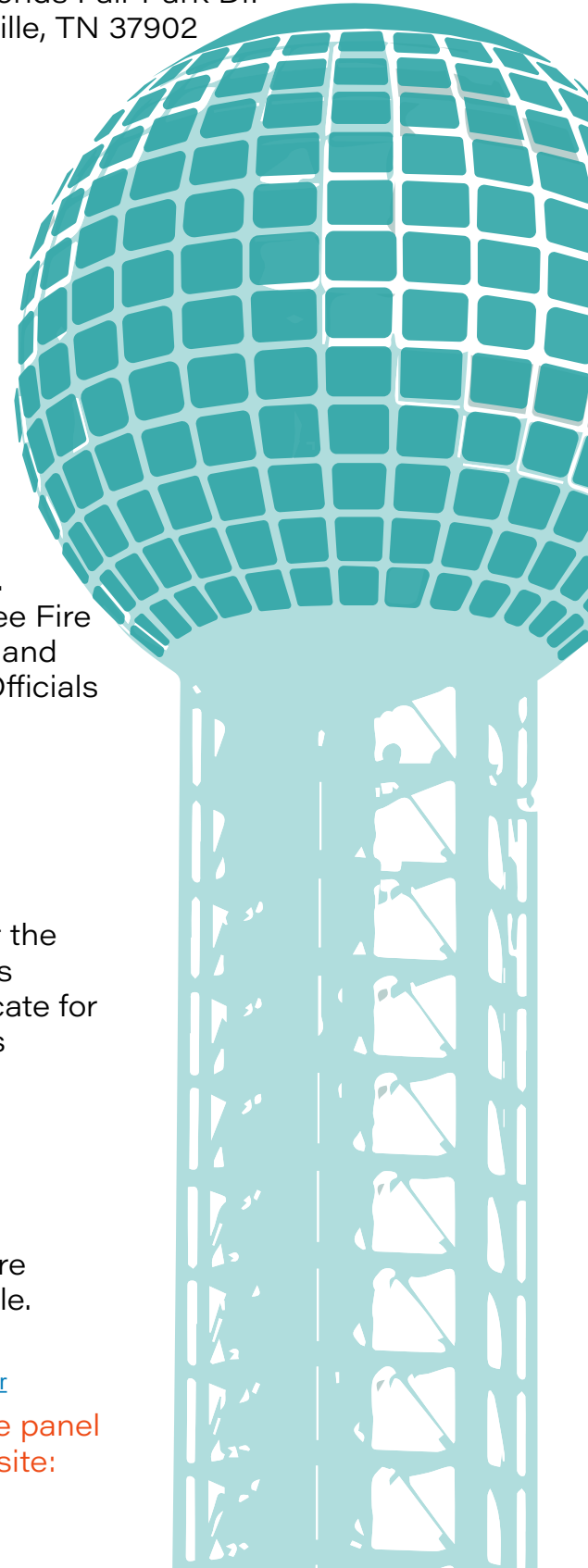

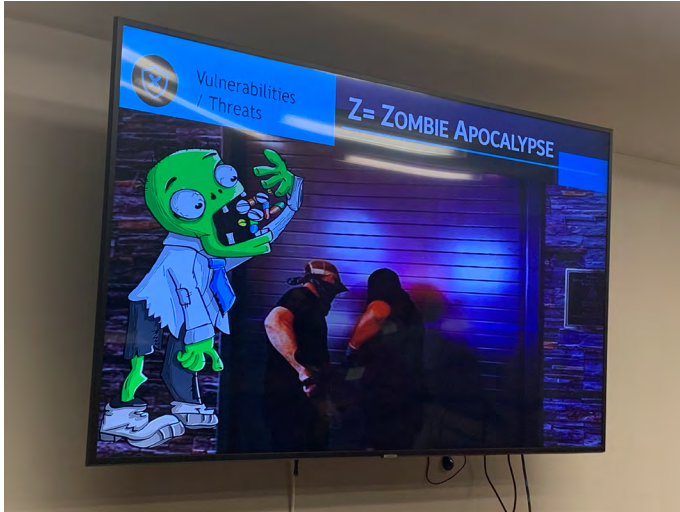
