





WHAT I LEARNED FROM CSI... UNDER PRESSURE...WATER LINES



We received a call from an apartment building developer

late one afternoon. We had designed a multi-floor apartment complex with a 3" domestic water line serving the building. The design intent was for the water bill to be included in the apartment rent instead of individual water meters for each apartment. The developer determined that the price of a 3" water meter was much more expensive than a 1" water meter. The developer was intending on

installing <u>three</u> 1" water meters instead of the 3" water meter to reduce the construction cost. We explained that <u>three</u> 1"water lines did not equal the same flow as one 3" water line. It wasn't until we sent a diagram of <u>five</u> 1"waterlines within a 3" water line did the developer understand his concept would not work. This is a concept that several people in the AECO industry have misunderstood in the past.




Another common concept is that the water meter size is one water line size smaller than the water line which is serving the building. If the city water pressure is not high enough, the water meter and the backflow preventer can introduce enough pressure drop and friction drop that the water pressure at the top floor is not high enough for a satisfactory bathroom shower spray. If the city water pressure is NOT high enough, the building can be equipped with a domestic water booster pump to boost the building water pressure high enough for satisfactory plumbing system operation. If you want to discuss these issues and other common construction items please come to the next local or regional CSI meeting.

Reduced Pressure Zone BackFlow Preventer (RPZ BFP)




PRESSURE DROP




